

Artist Sabine Asgodom

Sabine Asgodom has invented her life several times. She was born as a well-behaved daughter of two teachers in a rural part of Northern Germany.

19 years old, just having finished High School successfully, she was elected as one of 30 students out of 700 candidates of the Elite Journalist School of Germany, the „Deutsche Journalistenschule“ in Munich, Bavaria.

For the next 25 years she worked as an editor for several well known newspapers and magazines, i.e. Parents Germany and the German Cosmopolitan.

Sabine Asgodom, mother of two, started writing books about success and work-life-balance in her early thirties. Meanwhile she has published 35 books, many of them bestsellers, and some of them translated in English, French, Italian, Swedish, Polish, Korean and Chinese.

1999 she started her own business as speaker, trainer and coach in Munich. Today she is one of the best known keynote speakers in Germany, Austria and Switzerland.

She often is invited guest in Talkshows, radio and TV programmes all around Germany. In 2012 she got her own tv show „Sabine Asgodom“.

At the age of 65 Sabine Asgodoms third career started: in 2018 she began painting as balance to her busy life on stages, her travellings and entrepreneurship in her „Asgodom Inspiration Company“. Within a few months, she got known in the public as an artist, and was invited in August 2018 for her first exhibition in her agent gallery „Galerie Makowski“ at the famous Friedrichstraße in Berlin. Exhibitions on important Art fairs in Swizterland, Austria and Germany ensued.

Sabine Asgodom admires painters like Gerhard Richter, Yves Klein and Cy Twombly, but found her own style in shortest time, her „feather paintings“ are from high energy and delicate tenderness in the same time.
