

David Wells was born 1977 into an artistic family. He is an eclectic artist having worked professionally as an actor, graphic artist, dancer, web designer, circus and street performer, musician, children's entertainer and visual artist.

He has exhibited extensively, and has been awarded over 30 prizes for his art.

In April 2014 his portrait of The Duchess of Cambridge was presented to the royal family on their tour of Australia, and is now hanging in Kensington Palace.

His work has been regularly published in international journals, and has featured on the cover of both *"The Artists Magazine"* (2009) and *"The Pastel Journal."* (2009 and 2014).

Varied Exhibitions including Brisbane Parliament House over the last several years has placed David in a position of esteem with his colleagues.

*"I believe that a living person is more interesting than any artwork ever made; therefore, everyone is a masterpiece waiting to be painted."*

David is represented by OMSA Gallery at Hong Kong Asia Contemporary Art Show and China Art Canton in 2014.
